# What is “Process Art?”



- Focused on the experience of exploring the materials, tools, or techniques
  - A creative and joyful experience - no right or wrong
  - Open ended - no finished products as examples
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# What is “Process Art?” continued



- Often real world materials or photographs given as references
- No step by step directions to follow
- Each child's creation is unique and individual to them
- Child led, rather than teacher led

# Pre-Literacy Skills

- Vocabulary development
- Print goes from left to right (directional concepts)
- Print awareness
- Sequencing

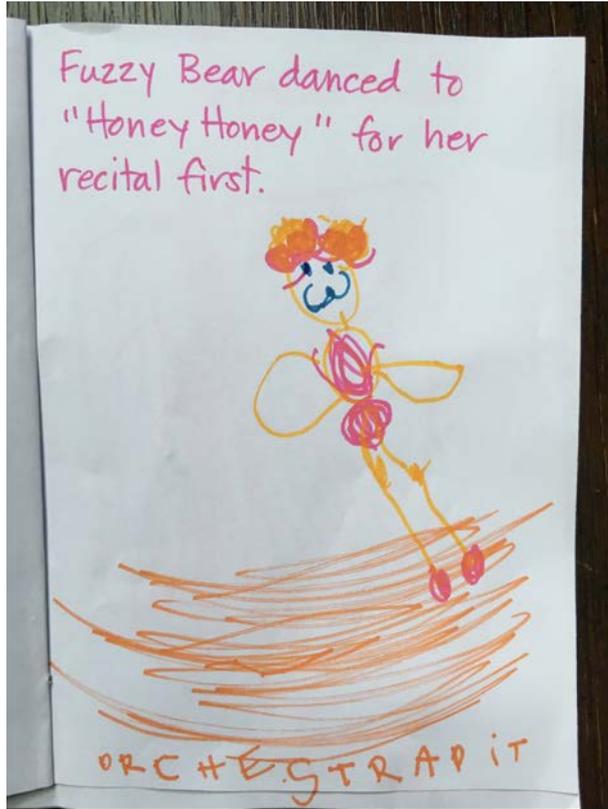


## Pre-Literacy Skills continued

- Fine motor skills/grasping writing tools
- Core strength
- Crossing the midline
- Bilateral coordination (writing with one hand and holding the page with the other)
- Imitation of movements

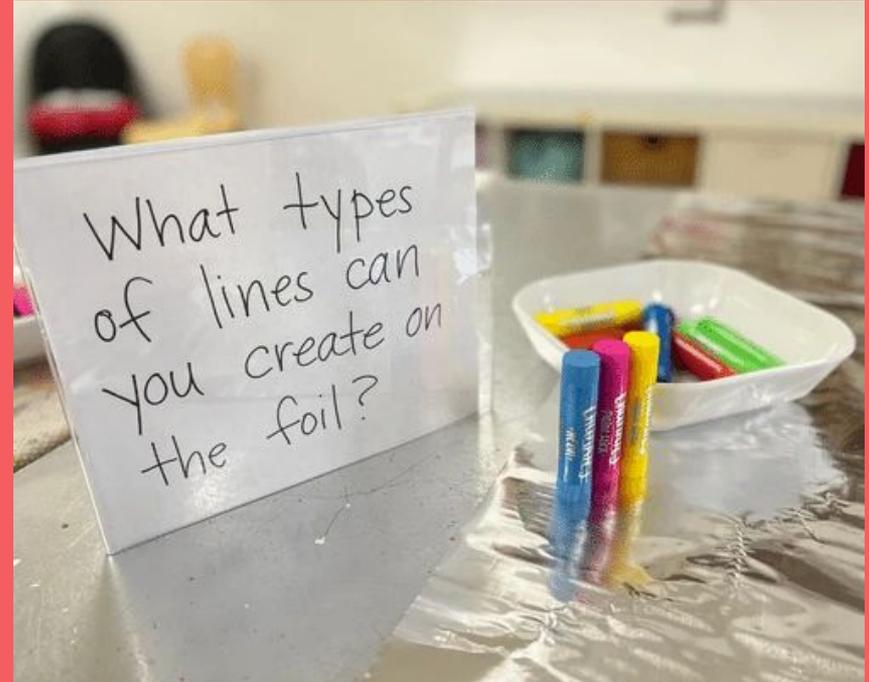

What pre-literacy skills do children gain when you label items in your art area with names and photographs?

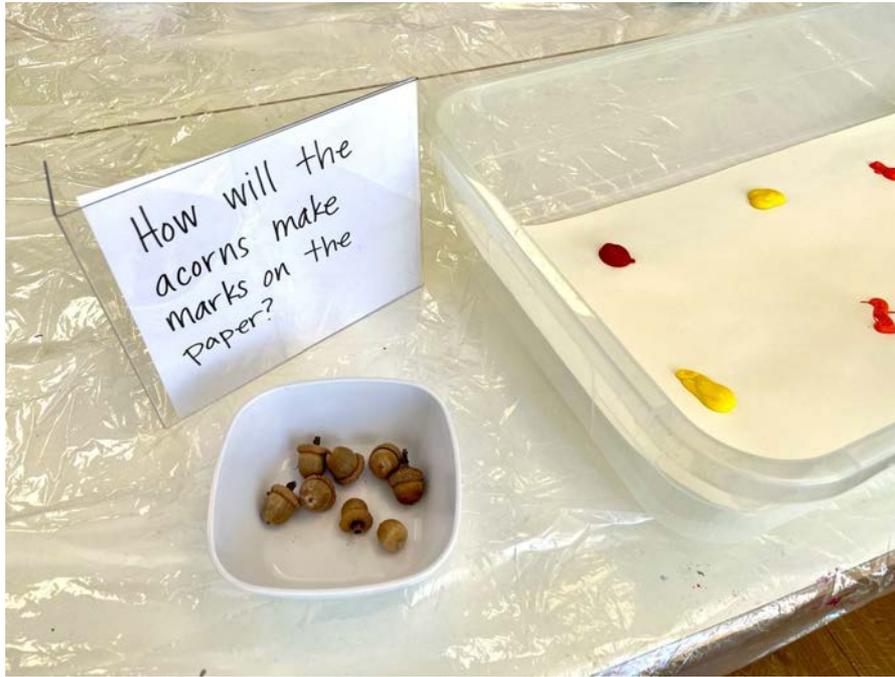


# Classroom Prompts

-Ribbons taped to the edge of the table

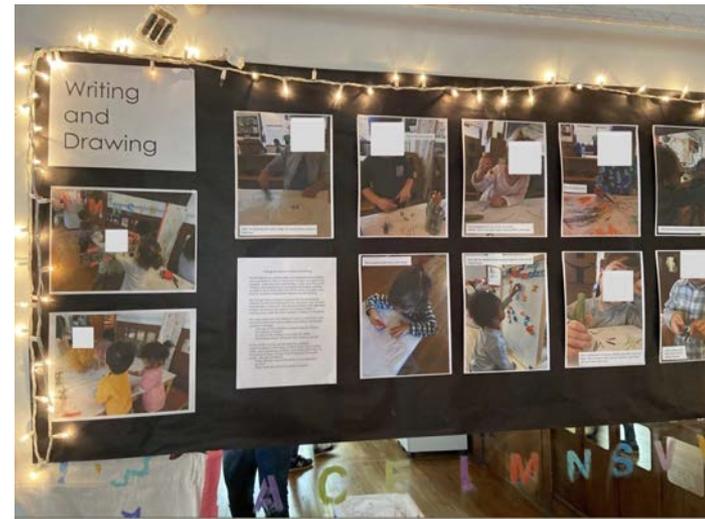
-Contact paper covering the table

What pre-literacy skills do children gain when they see their artwork and words displayed?

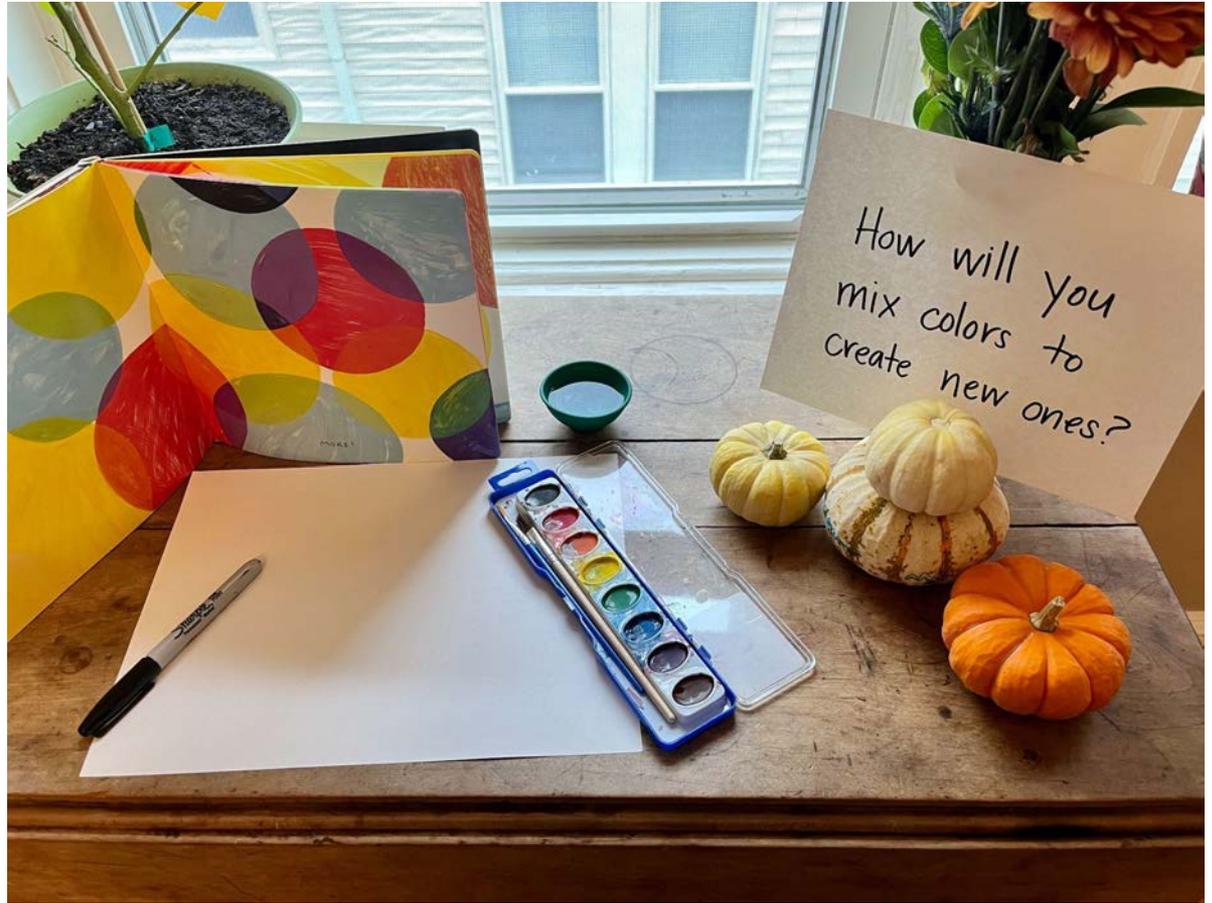

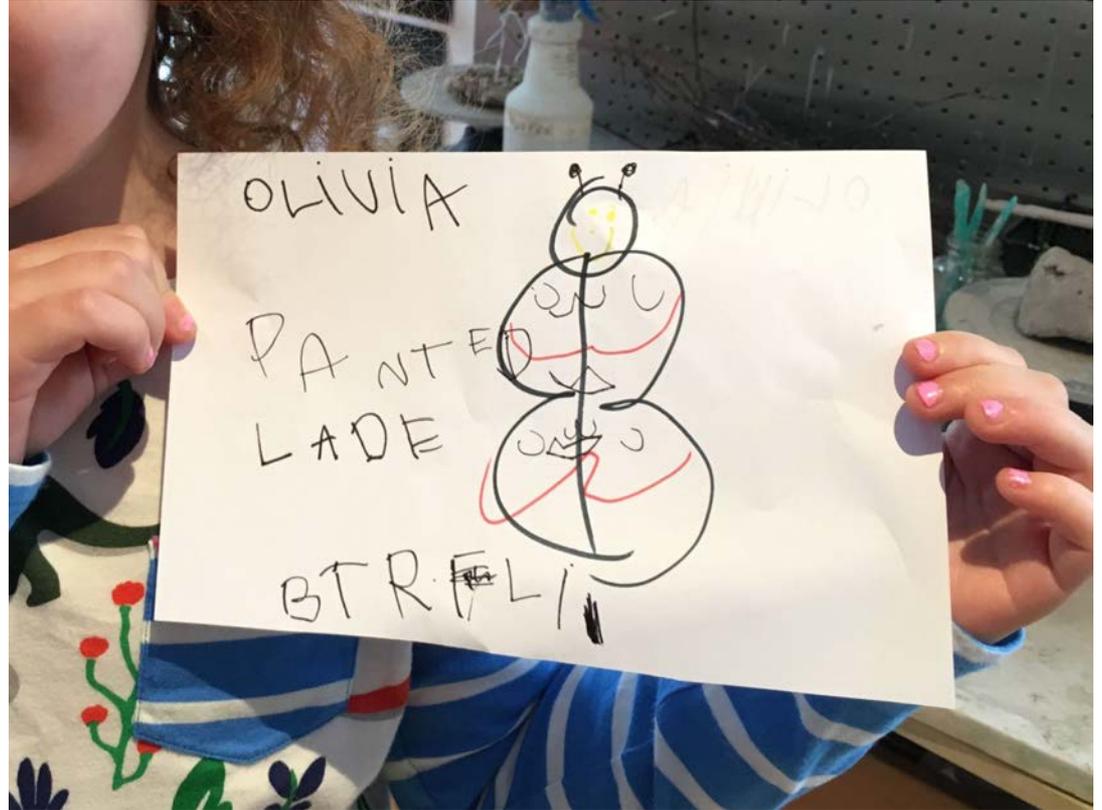
What pre-literacy skills do children gain when they are exposed to books and photographs as inspiration for creating?

# Ideas & Inspirations

How can each of the following projects inspire children's pre-literacy growth?

# Line Tracing



This promotes:

- Fine motor skills/grasp
- Crossing midline
- Imitating lines
- Following lines left to right

# Sensory Drawing



This promotes:

- Grasping writing tool
- Bilateral coordination
- Creating shapes and lines, which will later be used to make letters, numbers, or drawings

# Loose Parts Stories

This promotes:

- Vocabulary development
- Sequencing
- Fine motor skills
- Connecting print to spoken words



# Storytelling Quilt Squares

This promotes:

- Fine motor skills
- Integrating books and process art
- Planning story and how to represent it (sequencing; stories have beginning, middle, and end)
- Documentation and print awareness
